There, also within a multidisciplinary team, she provides care for some of the most seriously ill, treatment resistant and/or difficult patients throughout the region. Dr. Ilkov-Moor also enjoys continuity of care; seeing patients become outpatients again, and remaining well in the community, an extremely rewarding experience for her.

In addition, Dr. Ilkov-Moor is dedicated to medical education and quality care.
