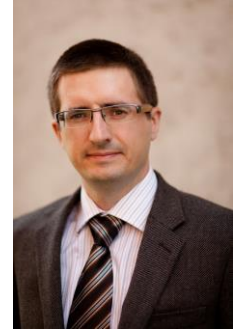


Dr. Dallas Seitz MD PhD

Dr. Seitz completed his MD at the University of Saskatchewan (2003) and his residency training in psychiatry at Queen's University (2008). Following residency he completed a research and clinical fellowship at the University of Toronto at Baycrest Centre and Women's College Hospital. He completed a PhD in Clinical Epidemiology and Health Services Research at the University of Toronto at the Institute for Health Policy, Evaluation and Management (2014).



Dr. Seitz is currently an Associate Professor of Psychiatry at Queen's University the Chair of the Division of Geriatric Psychiatry at Queen's University. He is also the current President of the Canadian Academy of Geriatric Psychiatry. His clinical work involves outreach to older adults in community, long-term care and hospital settings. Dr. Seitz has a clinical interest in dementia, neuropsychiatric symptoms of dementia, and late-onset mood disorders.

His research interests include knowledge translation in geriatric mental health, evaluation of the safety and efficacy of psychiatric medications for older adults, and health services research related to geriatric mental health conditions. He supervises psychiatry residents, geriatric psychiatry residents, and undergraduate and graduate students at the Centre for Neuroscience Studies and Public Health Sciences at Queen's University. His research has been supported by the Alzheimer Society of Canada, Alzheimer's Association, Canadian Institutes of Health Research, and Queen's University. He is actively involved in policy and advocacy work in Ontario and is the Provincial Medical Lead for Capacity Planning in Ontario.

When he isn't at work Dr. Seitz enjoys cycling, kayaking music, and trying to keep his 1973 Mach I Mustang on the road.
