



I completed my residency at Queen's after obtaining my MD from McMaster University. The application and interview process was one of the first experiences that led me to feel at home at Queen's. The faculty, residents, and administrative staff are approachable, friendly, and collegial. I had the great opportunity to work with a variety of supervisors who were knowledgeable and supportive.

I had an interest in research and administrative work early on in my training and I was introduced to many opportunities that helped develop my skills in research and leadership.
