## Keynote Speaker

### Dr. Cheryl Forchuk RN, PhD

Dr. Cheryl Forchuk is a Distinguished University Professor and Associate Director of Nursing Research at the Arthur Labatt Family School of Nursing (Western University) with a cross appointment to the Department of Psychiatry, Schulich School of Medicine and Dentistry (Western University). She is also a Scientist and Assistant Director for the Lawson Health Research Institute (Lawson), the research arm of both London Health Sciences Centre and St. Joseph's Health Care – London, as well as Group Leader of Mental Health/Health Outcomes Research at Lawson.

Dr. Forchuk received her Bachelor of Science in Nursing and Bachelor of Arts in psychology from the University of Windsor. She received her Master of Science in Nursing from the University of Toronto with a clinical specialty in mental health and her Ph.D. from the College of Nursing at Wayne State University.

Dr. Forchuk has published on many topics including transitional discharge, therapeutic relationships, technology in mental health care, poverty, housing and homelessness. She has published a book through Sage on Hildegard Peplau's interpersonal theory of nursing and has a book on mental health, housing and homelessness through Canadian Scholar's Press. She is currently working with Dr. A. Rudnick on a 6 book series on social science methods in health research which is to be published through Sage in 2017.

Dr. Forchuk has been honoured with numerous awards including the Order of Ontario, an honorary life membership in the Registered Nurses Association of Ontario and the Canadian Association of Advanced Practice Nursing, a Research Pioneer Award from Psychosocial Rehabilitation Canada, a mental health champion award from London area Canadian Mental Health Association, and a Fellowship in the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences.
