


DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHIATRY

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It is my pleasure to present you with the Department of Psychiatry 2014-2015 annual report. It has been another very successful year for the Department.

During the year, we have completed our three-year strategic planning exercise and are now focused on its implementation.

I invite you to review our successes and challenges as described here in detail. I will also invite you to visit our webpage at psychiatry.queensu.ca and our Facebook page at Queen's University Department of Psychiatry for up-to-date reflections of our work.

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Overview

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The undergraduate education program in psychiatry oversees the delivery of psychiatry teaching across the four years of medical school. In addition, a number of our faculty teach clinical skills, lead facilitated small group learning groups and supervise critical enquiry groups thus increasing the profile of psychiatry in the undergraduate medicine program. The psychiatry curriculum is a competency based curriculum, introduced in first year and progressing longitudinally across the four years in a relevant and integrated manner. The Director of Undergraduate Education is a member of the Residency Training Committee thus providing a liaison between undergraduate and postgraduate education programs in the Department.

Developments

Reviews of the clerkship and pre-clerkship courses have been very positive. We continue to develop more effective teaching and assessment practices. The psychiatry interest group continues. This is student-lead but is well supported by staff and residents. Last year, Dr. Behnia Haghiri directed the clerkship and Dr. Kevin Varley the pre-clerkship course. Both developed good collaborative relationships in the school of medicine and received very positive feedback from students. Since they are both relocating, the clerkship directorship has been taken over by Dr. Richard Millson who has made some insightful and exciting

changes already. Dr. Khalid Saeed will take over the pre-clerkship course. Drs Millson and Saeed have a wealth of clinical and educational experience and will enrich the program significantly. Dr. Fitzpatrick will mentor through their first iteration.

A number of our faculty have significant roles in the undergraduate medical program. Dr. Cherie Jones is the Director of Clinical Skills for Queen's Medical School and Dr. Renee Fitzpatrick is the Director of Student Affairs.

Education

Dr. Renee Fitzpatrick and Dr. Cherie Jones received a grant from the teaching and learning committee which was supplemented by the Department of Psychiatry Research Fund to develop a module for depression which has commenced with the class of 2018 and will be delivered over the course of first and second year. Dr. Fitzpatrick is chairing a subcommittee of COUPE to develop a national psychiatry curriculum. Drs Jones and Fitzpatrick have developed new seminars for the clerkship class on debriefing and resilience and plan to expand this curriculum.

Dr. Renee Fitzpatrick was the 2014 recipient of the Undergraduate Education Award for the Department of Psychiatry.

Dr. Cherie Jones was nominated for the CAME (Canadian Association of Medical Education) award for her innovations in the clinical skills curriculum.

Research

A number of medical students presented posters at National meetings from work done under the supervision of Department members.



Overview

The Residency Program Committee (RPC) is responsible for the planning and implementation of the residency program at Queen's University in accordance with the requirements of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC). Reporting directly to the Academic Affairs Committee and the Chair of the Department, the RPC is also responsible for the content of the curriculum and all evaluation procedures. The Committee meets monthly and is chaired by the Program Director (PD).

The responsibilities of the RPC are designated to Portfolio Managers (PMs). The PMs assume leadership for tasks of the RPC. These include, for example, curriculum review, resident evaluation and remediation, CaRMS selection process and rotation review. Each PM reports to the monthly RPC meeting.

In 2014, our Program introduced the roles of Academic advisors. Each of the faculty-psychiatrists RPC members is responsible for overlooking the training of 6-7 residents, documenting their progress, assisting with their CanMeds portfolio and identifying areas of strengths and weaknesses..

Developments

The Psychiatry Residency Program welcomed six PGY1s to the Residency Program: Jennifer Pickard, Jonathan Fairbairn, Tom Kim, Jamie Adirim, Peter Wang and Emily St.Denis.

The RPC revised the academic half-day schedule and psychotherapy teaching. Some of the highlights of the teaching schedule include teaching series on psychosexual disorders, and substance misuse.

Education

Residents are involved in the development of the curriculum which includes academic seminars, small group teaching sessions and workshops that promote interactive resident and faculty participation. Residents are encouraged to pursue their interest in teaching junior colleagues or students or research and the program supports their involvement in all the academic missions of the Department of Psychiatry.

The Program has provided protected time every Wednesday from 1.00 – 4:30 for residents to attend their academic teaching which include Interviewing skills, PDMs as well as core seminars.

Residents attend courses in Cognitive Behavior Therapy (Dr. Michela David) and supportive psychotherapy (Dr. Leslie Flynn).

Research

Residents were actively involved in research activities in 2014. Their research was presented at the American Psychiatric Association, Canadian Psychiatric Association, European Psychiatric Association and Queen's Department of Psychiatry Research Day.



Overview

The Faculty Development Planning Committee shall be advisory to the Department of Psychiatry Council, Queen's University regarding planning of educational activities that will support academic roles of persons working within the programs of the department. This includes psychiatrists and allied health professionals engaged in the academic mission of the department.

Its primary role is to support the academic development of the department by facilitating and encouraging teaching and scholarship. The focus will be on:

- Teaching Skills Development
- Career Development
- Faculty development presentations/seminars on Enhancing student motivation, Professionalism, Preparing the Teaching Dossier
- Career planning with faculty

Developments

Four main scholarship topics for career development were identified:

- 1. Quality Improvement
- 2. Education Development and Research
- 3. Transitional Youth
- 4. Genetics and Translational Neuroscience.

These themes will be implemented as mentorship themes and faculty members internal or external to the department will be sought to take on the role of mentor. We aim to develop a departmental model of mentorship.

The involvement of the allied healthcare workers in the career planning discussions will be facilitated in the future by Paul Kasurak and/or Jessica Jones.





Overview

The department has a wide range of research and clinical studies resources. Our research units have well-developed infrastructure to support our studies and welltrained staff that have many years of both clinical and research experience

Research Day

Our annual Research Conference was held May 30, 2014 at the Residence Inn by Marriott. There were approximately 80 people in attendance. We were able to hold break-out sessions again this year. Dr. David Lewis came from the University of Pittsburgh to give a talk titled "A Neural Substrate for Impaired Cortical Network Oscillations and Cognitive Dysfunction in Schizophrenia". This talk was well received.

Developments


The fellowship committee has representatives from Adult Psychiatry, Mood Disorders, Geriatrics, Child Psychiatry and Consultation Liaison Psychiatry. The committee also has a budget.

There have been two fellows accepted in mood disorders,

in addition one in child psychiatry and one in consultation liaison. The applicants are mainly from Saudi Arabia, with the consultation liaison specialty appearing to be the preferred.

The process for the applicants has been streamlined now with initial clearance of sponsorship from the post graduate medical education office.

The financial remuneration has now been increased to \$33,000 annually per applicant for the department as it is split 3 ways with post graduate medical education and the university.

Overview

Synergy is published twice a year by the Queen's Department of Psychiatry. The journal is scholarly in outlook but not necessarily number of footnotes. We strive to publish good prose and ideas presented with vigor. Developments

Synergy had another successful year in 2014 with the publication of articles on Schizophrenia and Autism as well as Technology and Medicine.

Inpatient Services

Adult Mental Health Inpatient Program:

We currently have three inpatient units providing inpatient care to 60 clients. Two units focus on recovery, wellness and resilience, engaging the clients in intensive treatment, symptom management, improving functioning and living skills while engaging with supports to enable their return to the community. The third unit focuses on enabling recovery by providing positive behavioural techniques, skills acquisition and adapting the environment to enable success.

We are currently moving forward on a second re-engagement of staff around group and individual programming planning to meet the identified needs in client care plans.

We continue to have a relationship with the Mental Health Support Network of SE Ontario providing linkages to peer support in the community as clients are discharged.

Outpatient Services comprise of

Schizophrenia/Rehabilitation Outpatient Services

The majority of the Kingstonbased outpatient services associated with the Schizophrenia/Rehabilitation Service are co-located at 525 and 533 Montreal Street. The interdependence of the services at the Montreal Street sites enhances care and promotes efficient use of resources.

Mood Disorders Research and Treatment Services

Personality Disorders Outpatient Services:

A research study has recently been completed to test the effectiveness of the e-Managing Powerful Emotions (E-MPE) Group, and the results have been submitted for publication. This the first time that DBT groups have been provided in an electronic format.

Adult Mental Health Outreach:

The AMH program is a leader in mental health program integration and accessibility. Examples of our successful partnership are AMH's continued relationship with Frontenac Community Mental Health and Addiction Services and our Sharbot Lake Outreach Clinic.

Our CMHS team is a step-down

service for clients formerly serviced by the Montreal Street outpatient teams.

Developments:

In 2014 the AMH program continued to move forward to mimic, as closely as possible, what the program will look like when we move into the new hospital. Many meetings were held to consider design, changes and future goals. AMH staff have been engaged in meetings and planning sessions around the new hospital. We continue to look at every aspect of the hospital and how we can best provide care and services to our clients in our new physical surrounding. It is anticipated that the hospital will be ready for occupancy in April 2017.

VOCEC opened a new café, Breaking Ground, at the YCMA. Breaking Ground operates a commercial kitchen and provides meals/snacks to the largest daycare in Kingston. The number



of clients who have jobs increased from 52 to 85. Clients now have the opportunity to work in more than one job, i.e. the total number of positions is approaching 100. After three consecutive years with modest losses, VOCEC was profitable again in 2013/14 turning a net income of \$12,000

Providence Care co-hosted the Ontario ACT Association Conference, October 22-24, 2014. Doing Whatever It Takes: Ethics in Action assembled a total of 48 speakers (11 from Providence Care) as well as 5 poster presentations and Special Guest Speaker, Steven Paige, for this event. A total of 298 delegates came from across Canada to participate in this event, which was very well received.

The ePR continues to move forward at Providence Care. Several AMH staff have participated in training and peer support.

Karin Carmichael and Yolanda Oczkowski are participants in a national interprofessional initiative hosted by the University Hospital Network and the Canadian Interprofessional Leadership Collaboration. They are attending as the Queen's University and Providence Care sponsored team. Their Capstone project builds on collaboration with the Rural Kingston Health Link which will identify Complex Mental Health clients who would benefit from the specialized Outreach service provided by Providence Care. Dr. Joe Burley

has identified 20 such clients and the PC Outreach Service is currently in the engagement and service delivery planning/ implementation phase of the project. The vision statement for this project is: "People are treated as a whole person through the integration of primary care and mental health services in their local community"

Karin Carmichael and Karen Hanewich, Privacy Office, KGH are co-leads on a personal health information sharing initiative with our regional partners including Frontenac Community Mental Health and Addiction Services, Hotel Dieu Hospital, Kingston General Hospital, Lennox & Addington Addiction and Community Mental Health Services, Lennox & Addington County General Hospital and Providence Care. This initiative promotes a consistent approach to regional personal health information sharing to support the delivery of safe, timely and quality

health care by all partners in the initiative. It is expected that this will expand more widely across the region to include other health providers beyond the initial participants. Information and train-the-trainer sessions are planned for January 2015.

Recruitment:

Dr. Adil Al-Mousawi joined the Division of Developmental Disabilities and has responsibility for two AMH inpatient beds as well as community clients.

Education:

Physicians in AMH are actively involved in many aspects of education.

Department of Psychiatry Teaching:

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DIVISION OF



Overview

In 2014, the acute care services of the Adult Division were comprised of 5 main programs: emergency and crisis psychiatry, acute inpatient services, consultation/liaison psychiatry, Intensive Transitional Treatment Program (ITTP), and acute outpatient services.

Inpatient Psychiatry

We have recruited a family physician to the ward, who is invaluable in dealing with medical co-morbidities of Burr 4 patients.

Emergency and Crisis Psychiatry

Five staff psychiatrists each cover KGH ED and HDH urgent care centre one day a week. Two of the psychiatrists also provide consulting services to the crisis and Transitional case management teams at FCMHAS.

Two Mental Health social workers and two FCMHAS crisis workers work closely with emergency psychiatry to create an interprofessional team with community partnership. An active teaching rotation in emergency psychiatry is available to junior and senior psychiatry residents, emergency medicine and family medicine residents and clinical clerks. Emergency psychiatry teaching rounds take place on a monthly basis. The RAPAS (Rapid Access to Psychiatric Assessment Services) is run by the SW and crisis worker team to facilitate rapid access to hospital and community based mental health and psychiatric services. RAPAS links very closely with ITTP and the Transitional Case management Team at FCMHAS.

The Emergency Psychiatry team works very closely with Emergency Medicine which have lead to a number of initiatives including: development of a medical clearance protocol, implementation of a safety protocol, and education of nursing staff. There has also been collaboration and advocacy for care of the elderly presenting with delirium and dementia in the ED and hospital. We are in the process of developing algorithms for complex psychiatric and addiction presentations to ER.

A 24-hour call back program for patients seen in psychiatric emergency at KGH then discharged is being implemented.

Inpatient Psychiatry

Burr 4 inpatient ward at KGH is comprised of a seven bed intense observation area, two short stay beds, and a 28 bed ward with two over capacity beds for a total of 37 beds, or at over capacity, 39 beds. The ward is staffed by a multidisciplinary team including six psychiatrists, with access to consultation by geriatric psychiatry and developmental disabilities. There has been increased implementation of groups on the ward, and active development of the PGY 2 core rotation to include teaching rounds three times weekly and group therapy experience. There is active liaison with community mental health services, including participation of FCMHAS workers in multidisciplinary rounds. Many patients are now discharged through the ITTP and onto community services.

Outpatient Psychiatry

Acute outpatient services receive over 150 intake referrals per month. The outpatient services are comprised of general psychiatry and sub-specialty including: addiction psychiatry, mental health and the law, anxiety

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disorders, ADHD/bipolar disorder research clinic, reproductive psychiatry, shared care, and 2 externally funded programs: which are externally funded: eating disorders and early intervention in psychosis. Members of the multi-disciplinary team run the following therapy groups: CBT-based, psychoeducation and relaxation training as well as DBT-based and concurrent disorders groups.

Members of the division provide shared care and local outreach to the following agencies: Street health Centre, FCMHAS, Queen's Family Health Team, Maple Family Health Team, Lennox and Addington Community Addiction and Mental Health Services, Moose Factory and the James Bay region.

Consultation/Liaison Psychiatry

In 2014, a follow-up CL psychiatry survey was completed by physicians at KGH and there were marked improvements noted in the satisfaction with the service with comments indicating much higher rates of satisfaction than before. CL has refocused on the liaison portion of CL. CL psychiatrists are actively involved in case conferences, family meetings, service rounds and research projects related to patients on the wards at KGH and SMOL.

Intensive Transitional Treatment Program (ITTP)

The ITTP is a new program in our Division that started operation in September 2014. It is fully externally funded by the SEO LHIN. This program is an intensive short term one that helps patients transition from the inpatient ward back into the community, seamlessly bridging their care to outpatient and community mental health services. The ITTP also accepts patients from the emergency department and will soon be accepting referrals from the community as well. The ITTP

service can provide an alternative to hospitalization and is expected to prevent some hospital admissions and readmissions and facilitate earlier discharge for patients.

The ITTP is a daily 4-week program run by a multidisciplinary team. The program is group oriented with CBT, psychoeducation, and DBT-based groups that provide support and development of skills. The program is flexible and includes psychiatric care and psychological assessment as needed. Currently there are no medical learners involved with the ITTP, but developing rotations for medical students and residents in ITTP is a priority for 2015.

Developments

- Dr. Abo-El Ella and Dr. Bajaj, joined our division this year.
- Dr. Behnia Haghiri and Dr. Kevin Varley took over the role of Director of Undergraduate Education for the Department of Psychiatry. Recently both Drs. Varley and Haghiri have taken up positions at Brockville General Hospital and continue with adjunct affiliations with our department.
- Divisional Members organized, hosted and presented the annual conference on Early Intervention in Psychosis.
- Dr. Susan Finch was a member of the SEO Addictions and Mental Health Redesign Future State Planning team and the transitional alliance; divisional members have been actively involved in giving feedback to the process.
- Dr. Nadeem Mazhar has become the Director of Quality Improvement for the Department of Psychiatry, and is actively involved in Quality committees and initiatives across KGH and HDH.
- A LEAN process has been focused on the interface of Emergency Psychiatry and adult inpatients at KGH and community services under the leadership of Dr. Farooq Naeem.
- Dr. Farooq Naeem has led the development and evaluation of an intensively guided self-help for Crisis Resolution and Home Treatment Teams clients, Kingston, Ontario.
- Dr. Moustafa Eid developed a clinic for psychodynamic psychotherapy at Hotel Dieu Hospital.
- Dr. Tariq Munshi initiated a Debates based program on the Maudsley Debates. The inaugural session was in November 2014. The plan is to apply for accreditation for this event through the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.
- Dr. Tariq Munshi became Director of Fellowship Training for the Department of Psychiatry.

Education


All members of the Adult Division of Psychiatry (acute) are actively involved in teaching and education at an undergraduate, postgraduate and professional development level.

Clinical clerk medical students rotate regularly through many of the rotations of the adult division.


The Division of Adult Psychiatry (acute) is responsible for teaching and supervising a number of core resident rotations including the PGY 2 core rotations in inpatient and outpatient psychiatry, Consultation Liaison Psychiatry, Emergency Psychiatry, Addictions Psychiatry and Shared Care. In addition, a number of elective rotations are available within the division including Early Intervention in Psychosis, and Eating Disorders.

Research

Members of the division are involved in a number of research projects in a variety of areas including medical education. Dr. Pallavi Nadkarni is the Divisional Director of Research. One of the major initiatives has been to bring standardized questionnaires and tools into all our clinical encounters.



DIVISION OF Child and addescent psychiatry



Overview

The Division provides evidencebased, multi-disciplinary assessment and intervention for a wide spectrum of psychiatric disorders for children below the age of 18 years. The yearly new referral rate is 1200.

Ambulatory Clinics

- 1. Mood and Anxiety Clinic
- 2. Neuro-Developmental Clinic
- 3. Eating Disorders Clinic
- 4. Urgent Consult Clinic
- 5. School Consultation

Treatment and Interventions

Assessment and treatment are based on best practice guidelines. Interventions include:

- 1. CBT: Individual and/or groups
- 2. Behaviour Therapy: individual and/or groups
- 3. Solution focused Family Therapy
- 4. Parent Groups for children with disruptive disorders and anxiety disorders
- 5. Distress Tolerance Group (based on DBT)

- 6. Online psychoeducation for wait list patients and e-CBT.
- 7. Youth DBT group in affiliation with Personality Disorders Services at Providence Care.

Inpatient Unit

This 8-bed diagnostic assessment and treatment unit is located at the Kingston General Hospital. The average length of stay is 5 days.

Developments

Education

We submitted an application for child psychiatry subspecialty and were successful. We are now a Royal College fully accredited subspecialty program. Dr. Khalid-Khan worked closely with Dr. Leverette to complete this application.

Dr. Abdulhadi Alhabbad, from Saudi Arabia, is currently doing a fellowship in the division.

We had our first combined Child Psychiatry and Pediatric CPD event for primary care through Queen's CPD program.

Clinical

We successfully recruited a 6th psychiatrist for a SEAMO funded position

Dr. Khalid-Khan has established and led centralized triage for mood and anxiety disorders in collaboration with Kingston Family Health Team and Pathways for Children and Youth. It has now expanded to Frontenac Medical Associates. The plan is to include all family health teams and family doctors in Kingston and also include neurodevelopmental disorders. This will increase access and reduce wait times. The CAMHUCC has been acknowledged for its outstanding service by the hospital and the community. Our Social Worker was the recipient of the Hotel Dieu Hospital Mission Award.

SELHIN funded a full-time Urgent Consult Clinic with brief intervention.

Research

There has been an expansion in research in our division. There have been many successful collaborations including Drs. Khalid-Khan as PI and Dr. Reddy as co-PI on the Sandbox/TELUS project: developing a personal health record for adolescents.

- Dr. Khalid-Khan is a co-PI with Drs. Tom Hollenstein (PI) and Isabel Granic (Department of Psychology at Queen's) on Ontario Mental Health Foundation funded grant: Mindlight: A Video Game Intervention to Reduce Child Anxiety.
- Dr. Khalid-Khan is a co-PI with Dr. Heidi Cramm (School of Rehabilitation Therapy at Queen's) (PI) on the grant "Targeting the Mental Health of Children Growing up in Military Families" funded by the Health Research Foundation.

Our faculty along with residents and students has presented numerous posters or oral presentations at local, national and international conferences this year.

The Division was chosen as the recipients of the 2014 B'nai Brith donation for its Child and Adolescent Mental Health Urgent Consult Clinic.

DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES





Overview

Division members provide comprehensive clinical services across Southeastern Ontario through the Developmental **Disabilities Consulting Program** (DDCP), housed at Ongwanada. The inter-professional team offers multidisciplinary and disciplinespecific "outreach" clinics beyond Kingston Frontenac Lennox and Addington to ensure access to small communities and rural areas across Southeastern Ontario (i.e. Hastings Prince Edward & Lanark Leeds Grenville) Clinics are "collaborative and consultative" with care providers and thereby supportive of community advocacy with local practitioners and agencies across the region.

Education

TEACHING ACTIVITIES

Students from different disciplines gain clinical experience with developmental disabilities and also benefit from working and learning within a collaborative, patient-centered healthcare team. The following teaching and educational initiatives were delivered in 2014:

INTERPROFESSIONAL TEACHING ACTIVITIES

In addition to clinical training, the DDCP faculty is also involved in modeling and promoting an interprofessional education and practice model. In these activities there is an active and overt effort to have "clinicians from different professions" teach "students from different professions"

 Faculty of Health Sciences/Arts: Interprofessional Intellectual Disabilities Education Day: September 26th 2014 - This year 386 students from Medicine (2nd yr), Occupational Therapy (1st yr), Physiotherapy (1st yr) and Psychology (PhD) participated; in addition 51 hosts with intellectual disabilities and their advocates attended.

- 2) Faculty of Health Sciences: Interprofessional Concise Course in Dual Diagnosis - This year's Concise Course was held May 26th -28th 2014 for a group of 15 students including psychiatry residents, psychology residents, social work students, family medicine residents and behaviour therapists.
- 3) School of Medicine: Psychiatry Clinical Clerkship: Advanced Interviewing Skills - This year seminars were conducted every
 6 weeks for clinical clerks assigned to psychiatry rotations in the city of Kingston reaching approximately 50 students.
- 4) School of Medicine: Second Year UME: Interviewing Skills for Patients with Communication Impairments - In 2014, this seminar was offered Sept 25th, 2014 to build upon learning objectives provided in the IDE day and to promote skill application to a wider patient population
- 5) Psychiatry Resident Training: Dual Diagnosis and Contact in the ER - In 2014, this seminar was offered to provide exposure to salient issues when working with individuals with dual diagnosis, in particular, clinical issues in the ER

6) Dual Diagnosis Clinical Teaching Rounds for Healthcare Students -Weekly seminars were offered to placement graduate students from psychiatry, psychology, occupational therapy and family medicine to provide interprofessional education and cross-fertilization of professional curriculum and roles

Providence Care, Regional Forensic Services Program provides specialized assessment, treatment, rehabilitation, and follow-up to people with severe psychiatric illness who come into conflict with the law.

FORENSIC SERVICES PROGRAM, PROVIDENCE CARE-MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES, PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

- 30 bed inpatient unit
- Ambulatory care program that provides after care and clinical case management for NCR clients and other clients such as past NCR clients or At Risk clients

The program is part of the Division of Forensic Psychiatry, Queen's University.

- Waiting to see the impacts of Bill C-54 on our program

EDUCATION

The major areas of education offered in the past year have been: the SBAR communication tool, Metabolic Syndrome and Diabetes, Best Practice for IM injections, Tb and Mantoux training, Med Reconciliation, Dual Diagnosis videoconferences and training, Least Restraint training, reviews of Suicide Assessment Tool, Mental Status examination and tool to prepare for GRIT education, Community Treatment Orders, and the **Enhancing Our Relationships** course. Training was done with new equipment, the Bladder Scanner, the suction machine, and the BP tower, Pinel Restraints.



Overview

Inpatient Service

Our program underwent some restructuring over the past year with a change in number of inpatient beds from 60 beds to 30 beds at Providence Care. Regionally, Quinte Health Care has been working closely with our health region and geriatric psychiatry to support the opening of a new service, the Behavioral Support Transitional Unit, in Belleville. This unit will serve older adults with dementia and related conditions who have behavioral symptoms related to their illness. The BSTU has begun accepting patients in March, 2015. Through our outreach services we also support general adult psychiatry services at Kingston General Hospital and Quinte Health Care along with the general medical units of all the acute care hospitals in our region and St. Mary's of the Lake.

Outpatient Service

Growth has occurred in all three of our outreach teams. Last year we received a total of 1,475 new referrals to our ambulatory services which is an all-time high and volumes continue to grow with our aging population. Our service remains one of the few clinical services in our region to see older adults in their homes, long-term care or hospitals where they live and prefer to receive care. We have also been partnering closely with our colleagues in primary care developing shared care models in Portland, Verona, Kingston, Belleville, Brighton and Centre Hastings regions.

Developments

Dr. Dallas Seitz took on the position of Division Head and Clinical Director in our Division in October, 2014. He took over from Dr. Le Clair who had led the Division for the preceding 17 years and the Clinical Director position from Dr. Yousery Nashed. Both Dr. Le Clair and Dr. Nashed continue to provide clinical and academic leadership and support within the Division.

We were also very fortunate to have Dr. Maria Hussain join our Division this past year. Our Division was also recently approved by SEAMO for another full-time geriatric psychiatry position and we are currently in the process of recruiting a candidate.

Education

Our division continues to be very active in undergraduate, postgraduate, fellowship and continuing medical education and we have had a number of educational achievements in the past year.

We have had an increased number of psychiatry residents rotating through our Division with the expansion of the psychiatry residency program. A major milestone for our Division has been completion of our application for a Royal College Residency Program in Geriatric Psychiatry. Dr. Hussain will be starting in role of Program Director once our program has been approved.

Dr. Maria Hussain completed her one year clinical fellowship in December of 2014 and has since started as a new faculty member in our Division. We currently have a second fellow, Dr. Julia Kirkham. She joined our program in July, 2014 from the University of Saskatchewan and will be completing her fellowship at the end of June, 2015. Another fellow from Dubai, is planning to start in our program in September, 2015.

A successful Geriatrics CME event was held in February with our colleagues in geriatric and family medicine in Kingston. Over the past two years Dr. Seitz has been co-chair of the Canadian Academy of Geriatric Psychiatry Review Course and Online study course along with Dr. Mark Rapoport (University of Toronto) and Dr. Andrew Wiens (University of Ottawa). This year the national review course received an award from the Canadian Psychiatric Association for best continuing medical education event.

Research

Members of our Division were lead authors on 7 peer-reviewed publications with co-authorship on another 7 papers. Our faculty, fellows and students presented 20 poster or oral presentations at scientific meetings this past year. Research funding in our Division continues to increase with our Division members currently listed as principal applicant on research projects totaling 1.4 million dollars and our faculty are currently listed as co-applicants on research grants totaling 2.0 million dollars.

Some highlights of our research accomplishments this past year include Dr. Seitz being named a co-lead on the Canadian Consortium in Neurodegeneration in Aging Team Grant with Drs. Herrmann and Dr. Lanctot at Sunnybrook

hospital which received \$793,000 over five years to conduct research studies related to behavioral symptoms of dementia in longterm care settings across Canada. Dr. Julia Kirkham received first prize at the American Association for Geriatric Psychiatry Early **Investigator Poster Presentation** competition this year for her research project "Meta-Analysis of Problem Solving Therapy for the Treatment of Major Depression in Older Adults". Amber Knuff successfully defended her MSc in Neuroscience at Queen's University this past year on the topic of "Application of Actigraphy to the Measurement of Neuropsychiatric Symptoms of Agitation in Dementia" this past year. Dr. Seitz also successfully defended his PhD in Clinical **Epidemiology and Health Services** Research in the Institute of Health

Policy, Management and Evaluation at the University of Toronto this past year.

Administration/ Leadership

Dr. Andrew is a member of the Care of Elderly residency program with geriatric medicine. Dr. Teitelbaum is a member of the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care Committee to Evaluate Drugs. Dr. Seitz is currently vicepresident of the Canadian Academy of Geriatric Psychiatry.

Clana's Big Ride

he University Hospitals Kingston Foundation submitted a proposal to host an event with six-time Olympic medalist Clara Hughes. Sponsored by Bell Let's Talk, Clara's Big Ride will took Clara Hughes across Canada stopping in various communities to speak to them about her personal struggles with depression in hopes of destigmatizing mental health issues.

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On March 24, 2014 an event was held in Kingston at the Ambassador Hotel, over 500 guests arrived to listen to a panel of local mental health experts who each shared their insights into mental health issues facing youth before hosting a question & answer period for the audience. Following this presentation Clara herself shared her story.

The goals of the event were to:

- To raise awareness about mental health issues and depression among our youth
- To make the community aware of mental health resources available locally
- To raise funds for CAN-BIND
- To engage a new demographic with UHKF
- To strengthen our partnerships with community groups and local health professionals
