

Department of Psychiatry Jim Owen Faculty Excellence in Teaching Award

This is awarded annually to a faculty member in the Department of Psychiatry at Queen's University who is deemed to have made the most valuable contribution to resident education in the preceding year. Any clinical department member involved in the full or part-time clinical teaching of residents is eligible with the exception of those award recipients within the past 5 years.

Selection of the award recipient will be made by the resident body, which is chaired by the Chief Resident(s) with input and guidance from the Postgraduate Program Director. All residents may nominate a faculty member to be considered for the award. All nominations must be held in confidence.

The candidates will be considered based on their contribution to resident education and the following criteria:

- passion and dedication for teaching
- quality of teaching and supervision
- proficiency in delivering clear and relevant information
- comprehension, and appropriate use of the literature
- the recipient should encourage team based learning
- stimulate discussion, and provoke critical thinking

The nominated faculty should demonstrate interest in residents' personal development, commitment to the evaluation process. The nominee should present as a role model of professional behavior and attitude with residents, patients, and mental health team members.

The award consists of an inscription on the Excellence in Teaching Award Plaque.
