Residency Program in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry

Queen's University, Department of Psychiatry, Division of Child & Adolescent Psychiatry is now accepting applications for the Residency Program in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry for the 2022-2023 academic year.

The Residency Program in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry is approved from the Royal College of Physicians & Surgeons of Canada. The program offers rich training in both inpatient and outpatient clinics (Mood and Anxiety Disorders, Neurodevelopmental Disorders, Eating Disorders and Urgent Consult Clinic). In addition, we have strong collaborations with our community partners (community mental health agencies in Brockville, Belleville, Smiths Falls, and Kingston), local school boards and Family Health Teams.

Requirements:

In order to apply for the Residency Program in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry, an individual must be a physician who:

1. Has completed either the 4th or 5th year of Psychiatry training with a FRCPC in Psychiatry or equivalent.
2. Is licensed by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario to practice medicine or will be eligible for a license by June 30, 2022.

Application Deadline:

All application documents must be received before midnight on Wednesday, September 1, 2021.

Interviews for the Residency Program in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry at Queen's University will take place between September 27, 2021 – October 15, 2021.

Successful candidates will be notified on October 28, 2021 and will have until 2pm EST November 4, 2021 to respond either accepting or declining the offer.

Application Process:

The applicant should submit:

1. A brief letter of intent outlining
 - a) The desire to apply for the Residency Program in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry at Queen's University

- b) Career plan and how the Residency Program in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry at Queen's University will help to further this plan
2. Curriculum vitae
3. Letter of good standing from the current Psychiatry Residency Program Director, if in a residency program. If already completed residency training, the applicant should arrange for a letter from their Department Head or equivalent, or from a past Residency Program Director if their training ended less than five years ago
4. Two letters of reference from a Child & Adolescent Psychiatrist

Submission of the Application:

Applications may be submitted either on paper or electronically via e-mail, but must be received by the deadline.
